LINCOLN AVENUE DEVELOPMENT, LLC PROJECT NARRATIVE

The attached application for financial assistance from the Town of Colonie Industrial Development Agency is intended to support the efforts of the Applicant in the development of an approximately 28-acre parcel located at 950 First Street in the Town of Colonie at a total anticipated project cost of \$11,070,000.

The proposed development will consist of the construction of four mixed use commercial flex space-distribution/warehousing buildings as follows and as depicted on the attached site plan map:

Building #2 consisting of 10,000 square feet of space
Building #3 consisting of 10,000 square feet of space
Building #4 consisting of 15,000 square feet of space.

The project is intended to be carries out in multiple phases. Initially the applicant is proceeding with construction of building #3 which will consist of commercial office space to be occupied by Peter Luizzi & Brothers Contracting, Luizzi Construction Services and Luizzi Property Management to serve as its corporate headquarters. The applicant is requesting a deviation from the Agency s UTEP in light of the fact that the operations in building #3 will support development and management of the project site and that development of the project site as contemplated cannot occur without the construction of building #3. It is anticipated that the current facility housing the Luizzi companies will be utilized by another commercial occupant for a similar use. The preliminary plan of development for the subject property suggests that the next constructed building would be building #4 which will be leased out to warehousing tenants. It is intended that the remaining two buildings would be constructed as third-party tenants are identified and committed.

The proposed development is consistent with the plans for this area of the Town as adopted by the Agency relating to the Lincoln Avenue Brownfield Opportunity Area in terms of seeking to cause development of an historically underutilized portion of the Town of Colonie and alleviate traffic congestion through nearby residential areas.

Due to the intention to develop the subject property over time, the Applicant is requesting that the Agency grant financial assistance including real property tax abatements on a building by building basis as applicable. This will allow the Applicant to provide necessary incentives to future third party qualifying tenants in order to allow for the full development of the project. Also as noted above, the Applicant will use this assistance to help lessen the large investment of building the main road infrastructure and utilities to the Town of Colonie standards so that the road can be dedicated in the future to fit into the larger

picture of Town planning for the geographic area. To assist the Agency in implementing a building by building real property tax abatement, the Applicant is willing to either seek subdivision of the property into four distinct lots or to request that the tax assessor assign suffix numbers to each structure.

If the Agency does support the project it will give the applicant a more secure financial base to provide the infrastructure improvements requested by the Town of Colonie and also support building a complex that will bring businesses in to a location within the Town that has previously been underutilized as to which the Town has encouraged development.

Based upon a review of the Agency s Uniform Tax Exemption Policy, the Applicant feels that the proposed project qualifies for enhanced real property tax exemptions under the described Enhanced Grow Colonie Program for the following reasons:

The intended use of the project site involves flex space (warehouse/distribution) As set forth below, it is anticipated that new job creation within three years of the commencement of operations for each building will exceed the 10-job minimum requirement

As discussed above, the project site comprises a portion of a larger site which has sat undeveloped for a period exceeding ten (10) years and is a large portion of the 370 acre Colonie Lincoln Avenue Brownfield Opportunity Area.

Proposal to dedicate road infrastructure to the Town to benefit the Route 32 Linkage study.
